In class we have been exploring the mental strategy of rounding and adjusting for multiplication.


<u>Task</u>: Use rounding and adjusting to complete the following number sentences, remembering to show your workings:

<u>Literacy</u>

This week we are learning all about using the prefixes 'ir-' and 'il-'. This week's task will involve the following words:

Task: Choose one of the boxes above and write down each word three times on the same line, with space in between.

Then, write a sentence that makes sense for each word. This will involve you finding out their definitions to then make sure your sentences make sense.

You should use cursive (joined) handwriting.

Challenge: Write a short story that includes either **a**) each word from one of the optional word lists, OR **b**) each word from both lists. You can decide on the genre of your story, but you must make sure you punctuate appropriately throughout.

Social Studies

Regardless of where and how you present your work, I would like you to include a slide / paragraph on how you think prejudice can be harmful in today's world, and what you would like to see happen to make sure that as a society we continue to grow an environment that celebrates diversity.

Finally – please think critically. How reliable are your sources? Can you use a mix of primary and secondary resources?
